Mary Ainsworth
Early responsive, nurturing care

- Teaches infants that the world is a safe place
- Teaches infants that their needs will be met
- Provides the foundation for successful social-emotional development throughout life

- · Rewards and punishment can change behavior
- · Humans can be conditioned to behave in certain ways

Psychoanalytic Theory

Sigmund Freud

- Exploration of the unconscious mind in order to cure
- All thoughts and activities are influenced by the unconscious mind

Cognitive Development Theory

Jean Piaget

- Children actively construct their own learning
- Consists of stages
 - Sensorimotor (Birth to 2 years)
 - Preoperational (2 7 years)
 - Concrete operations (7 11 years)
 - Formal operations (11 years and beyond)

Sociocultural Theory

Lev Vygotsky

- Social interaction leads to continuous step-by-step changes in children's thought and behavior
- Can vary greatly from culture to culture
